

Nebraska Bankers Association Scholarship Program With The University of Nebraska Foundation

The NBA's scholarship commitment this year totaled \$140,500. Since 1995 the NBA has awarded 263 four-year scholarships to UNL and UNK students and 31 merit-based scholarships to UNO students. The donations for these scholarships along with funding for various University of Nebraska internship programs, professorships, and University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) equipment purchases are provided each year through the NBA's University Foundation Allocation Committee.

During the 1970s, the NBA conducted a fund drive to establish the Nebraska Bankers fund within the University of Nebraska Foundation. The campaign raised approximately \$1 million, forming the foundation's largest single-industry fund. "This fund is part of an ongoing effort by the Nebraska banking industry to retain and attract the best and brightest students to our state and to the University of Nebraska campuses," said Kelly Holthus, chairman of the NBA's University Foundation Allocation Committee and president and CEO of Cornerstone Bank in York, Neb.
